In its initial phase of development, B.A. and B.Com. degree courses were started. Later in 1992 it was decided to start B.Sc., PG courses in 2001 and B.Voc. in 2018; the resolutions of MES were implemented successfully by the college. The college also runs Career Oriented Courses, Skill Based Courses, Add-on Courses and Value Added Courses along with Certificate Skill Courses in association with Symbiosis Skills Open University, Pune. The college got NAAC accreditation done in 2003, re-accreditation in 2011 and in 2017 with 'A' grade. The College has achieved an ISO 9001:2008 certificate in 2016 and ISO 9001:2015 in 2019 for its quality policies and work ethics. The Department of Botany, Chemistry & Geography have been recognized by Department of Biotechnology (DBT).

The college is permanently affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU), Pune (formerly University of Pune). The College has acquired 2(f) and 12(B) status of UGC, New Delhi. The college provides various academic facilities to attain bachelor degrees in the fields of Arts, Commerce, Science and Business Administration, as well as Master degrees in Arts, Commerce and Science. It has a Post Graduate Research Centre in Commerce approved by SPPU, Pune. The college not only ensures academic development of the students but also provides them with opportunities to prove themselves by undertaking research, extra-curricular and co-curricular activities. The college is empowering rural talents through distinctive movement under Yashwant Study Club for various competitive examinations.

- Fees should be paid in full amount during admission.
- Admission is as per merit and other norms as laid down by SPPU, Pune, UGC & Govt. of Maharashtra or the management from time to time.
- The Principal reserves the right to amend/modify the rules as received from the Govt. / University or the management, as the case may be. It will be accordingly notified on the College Notice Board at the time of admission.
- Students / parents are requested to go through the guidelines and admission notices displayed on the college Notice Board before seeking admission in the college.

B) Second Year (S.Y.) and Third Year (T.Y.) Degree Course:-

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. Admissions to F.Y.B.A. / B.Com. / B.Sc. / B.Voc./ M.Sc.-I shall be strictly on merit basis. Application for admission to the college should be made on the prescribed online admission form available on the college website by all students including those who were in the college during the previous year. Students should apply immediately after the declaration of the results of the pertinent examination of the previous year.
2. The students should fill in the online admission form and submit the printouts through admission committee.
3. The admission form duly completed in all respects and accompanied by requisite documents should be submitted to the college on or before the last date notified by the college. The list of requisite documents to be attached to the admission form is given in the next section. The admission forms which are incomplete or incorrectly filled or submitted late will be summarily rejected.
4. The admission form signed by the admission committee shall then be processed to generate the Fees Challan in the college office. The admission fees should be remitted in the Yash Multi State Bank available in the campus. The admission form along with the challan of paid fees should be submitted in the college office on the same day.
5. The reservation policy shall be in accordance with Govt. of Maharashtra norms and guidelines.
6. The admission granted by the college is provisional, until is confirmed by the University.
7. The admission in case of F.Y.B.B.A. / F.Y.B.B.A.(Computer Application), M.A.-I, M.Com-I shall be given on first come first serve basis.

A COMPULSORY COURSE IN ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS

(Compulsory at the S.Y.B.A. / B.Com. / B.Sc.)

A compulsory course in Environmental Awareness with duration of six months (40 Lectures) has been introduced from the academic year 2004-05 at the second year of degree course, by SPPU, Pune.

A candidate has to appear in the examination for this course (to be conducted by the college) in II term of the second year of the degree course in order to obtain degree certificate from the University. Students who do not succeed in this exam in the second year can reappear in the third year of degree course.

However, no student will be awarded degree by the University unless he/she clears this exam before convocation.

The pattern of examination will be as follows:

- c) Field Work/Project.....25 Marks

COURSE OF STUDY/CHOICE OF SUBJECTS

If he/she fails in more than 2 papers, he/she will not get admission to the Second year. Getting through all the papers of the First Year is mandatory for seeking admission to the Third Year.

1) F.Y.B.A.:

As per the circulars of SPPU, Pune, the first year students have to study Compulsory English and five other papers at general level from the groups B to G shown below. EXAMINATIONS - UG

The scheme of examination will be according to the University rules that are issued from time to time. The students are suggested to visit regularly the website: unipune.ac.in for knowing syllabus, question paper pattern, scheme of marking or any change in them. Currently the scheme of examination is as follows:

Term End Examination (20 Marks)

The term end examination will be generally conducted by the college during the month of October / November, as per the university norms. These examinations will be of 60 Marks and 2 hours duration. Marks secured out of 60 will be converted into 20. The result of the terminal examinations shall be displayed on the notice board. Attendance at the term end examinations is compulsory.

Annual Examination System (80 Marks) :-

The annual examination is conducted by the University at the end of academic year usually in the month of March. This examination will be of 80 Marks for each paper and 3 hours duration.

Semester System (Only S.Y.B.Sc. and T.Y.B.Sc.):-

There will be two examinations viz. – First Semester and Second Semester. Each Semester exam carries 50 marks per subject. Out of the 50 marks, 40 marks are based on external assessment and 10 marks on internal assessment by the college, as per university norms.

(For S.Y.B.A. / B.Com. / T.Y.B.A. / B.Com.)

- ❖ The annual examination of Business Communication (an autonomous subject) at S.Y.B.Com is conducted by the college.
- ❖ For F.Y.B.Sc., there are 20 Marks for internal assessment.
- ❖ In the practical subject a student shall be required to maintain a journal for practical work. The Practical Examination will be conducted prior to the annual theory examination.
- ❖ For F.Y. / S.Y. / T.Y.B.B.A. and B.B.A. (Computer Application): - There will be semester pattern from the year 2010-2011. The College will conduct the annual examination for F.Y.B.A./ B.Com. / B.Sc. and semester examination for F.Y.B.B.A. and F.Y. B.B.A. (Computer Application) There will be internal exams of each paper of 60 marks converted into 20 & external exams for each term. There is an annual examination pattern for S.Y. / T.Y.B.A. / B.Com.
- ❖ Any other change made by the SPPU, Pune shall be displayed on college/ university website and will be obligatory to all students.



5. Laboratory:

The Departments of Chemistry, Physics, Botany, Geography and Zoology have their own independent well-equipped and advanced laboratories. Equipments and chemicals required for the student of U.G. and P.G. classes are available in the laboratories.



6. Literary Association:

Literary Association has been established with an objective of achieving deep knowledge of these subjects. This association organizes various lectures, workshops and departmental seminars.



7. Science Association and AVISHKAR:



In the era of information technology and scientific temper, the study of fundamental science has become very significant. The association organizes various activities, educational trips, etc. These activities are intended to make the teaching learning process more lively and meaningful.

AVISHKAR is a project started by the SPPU, Pune from 2007 to develop the research culture in the minds of students of higher education. Under this programme student from any discipline and class has to choose a subject for his research with the help of his teacher in the college itself. After completion, he has to present it in the seminar when arranged by the University. He/She will get financial support from the University, if selected.

8. Commerce Association:

The association works with an objective of making the teaching and learning of commerce more practical, relevant and comprehensive. The association organizes lectures of the scholars, workshops, seminars, exhibitions, educational trips and commerce festival.

9. Yashwant Study Club for Competitive Examinations:

The center prepares students for various competitive examinations, especially for MPSC, UPSC, LIC and Bank examination by conducting coaching classes. While studying the graduate courses, students can appear for these examinations. It is conducted in three phases for F.Y., S.Y. and T.Y. The Examinations are based on MPSC / UPSC Pattern.



10. Vidyarthini Manch :



Special activities for girls' students are organized through the formation of interested group with a woman professor in charge of it. The emphasis has been on themes and issues relevant to girls in particular. As it is the part and parcel of our mission, the focus of interest is to make them self-reliant. The Manch organizes invited lectures too.

11. Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University Study Center:

The centre has started B.A. and B.Com. courses with a view of providing education to the unprivileged girls, boys and elders. A student aged 18 without S.S.C. or H.S.C. (They have to pass Preparatory program examination) is eligible to seek admission for the courses if they pass the preadmission test. The M.B.A. course of YCMOU also has been started from the year 2009-2010



12. National Service Scheme (N.S.S.):



The college has a NSS unit. Students, who are really interested in doing social work, are welcome to join the college NSS Unit. The actual enrolment however shall depend upon the University guidelines. The intake capacity is 200 students and for camp 100 students

13. National Cadet Corps (NCC):



The college has a separate NCC Unit for boys (50 cadet) and girls. All expenses on uniforms, kit, annual training etc. are borne by the Government. Students are encouraged to join NCC where they get Military Training which enables them to join the army.

14. Students Welfare:

This scheme is run from year 2000, under this scheme economically backward students' work in various departments of college and garden, such students have given remuneration for their work. For girls under the "Nirbhay Kanya Abiyan" economic support and guidance, for their Career is given. For poor students, under the special guidance cell essential guidance is given.



15. Alumni Association:

Arts, Commerce and Science College, Sonai Alumni Association has been registered. There are 17 members in the association. The association is actively involved in different academic and non-academic programmes. The college invites its alumni to register their details on the college website.

16. Student Council:

The student council is formed in accordance with the provisions of Maharashtra University Act 2016. One of the teachers is designated as working Chairman. The Principal is the Ex-Officio Chairman of the Student Council. One of the students of the college is elected / nominated as the General Secretary.

17. Group Insurance cover for Students:

The college is introducing a Group Insurance to the students of the college. The risk covered including death, loss of limbs, total/partial/permanent disablement.

18. Swimming Pool:



Olympic size Swimming Pool facility along with coaching is available in the college campus on paying nominal fees.

19. Soft Skill Development Programme:

The Programme of Personality Development in the era of LPG (Liberalization, Privatization and Globalization) has much more importance. The students from rural sector may not compete without this. The skills are imparted to the students through this programme which are commonly important. This programme is run under the aegis of SPPU, Pune from 2007.

20. Placement Cell:-

The career guidance and counseling is arranged and students are provided placements through this cell. Various companies are invited for the campus interview.

Library is the soul of the college. The main attraction of an academic community and the students is the college library. Various text books, reference books, encyclopedia, journals, magazines, newspapers, newspaper clipping are made available to the students.

A. Reading Hall:-

There are separate sections in reading hall for the girls' and boys' students. The reading hall is kept open from 8:00 am to 5.00 pm.



B. Book Bank:-

With the aegis of UGC and the college, a book bank is run for the poor and the needy students. Interested students may contact the librarian for membership of book bank scheme.



C. Scholar's Card:-



To promote excellence, Scholar's cards are issued to the top 5 students from each class. These cards facilitate students to borrow additional books for home reading (2 books instead of 1)

Discipline and Code of Conduct

Discipline:

Code of Conduct:

1. Students should always carry their valid college identity card in the college or whenever representing the college at any other place. Further it should be produced whenever demanded by anyone of the college staff.
2. During the lectures, students should not loiter in and around college premises.
3. Students are directed not to accompany any outsider in the college premises
4. While representing the college at any other place, the students should not act in the manner to harm the image of the college.
5. Students should not collect any funds from other students or from outsider without the written permission of the Principal
6. Students shall not organize picnics, excursion, trips, etc. on their own without prior written permission of the Principal.
7. The powers relating to the disciplinary action in the college will rest with Principal and his decision in this respect shall be final. Anyone who violate the code of conduct will be severely dealt with accordingly.

11. Using Mobile is strictly prohibited in the college campus.

UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009

To prohibit any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student; and thereby, to eliminate ragging in all its forms from universities and other higher educational institutions in the country by prohibiting it under these Regulations, preventing its occurrence and punishing those who indulge in ragging as provided for in these Regulations and the appropriate law in force.
