<u>Numerical data</u> - 1) The number of males and females in Yashwant Library is 74 and 26 respectively. It seems that the proportion of males is more than females.




Figure-1) Yashwant Library Male and Female Library Proportion




Figure-2) Figure-Number of books by year in Yashwant Library
