

Respected Sir,

With reference to above subject, we have organized a national level **Short Term Course** in History on “**Trends in Historiography towards Interdisciplinary Approach**” from **3rd to 9th October, 2018** at our college.

We had **33** participants from all over India, **4** of them from Kerala, **2** of them from Andhra Pradesh and rest of them from Maharashtra. **2** of them from Sant **Gadgebaba** Amravati University, Amravati, **3** from Kaviyatri Bahinabai Choudhari North Maharashtra University Jalgaon, **1** from Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University Nanded, **10** from Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University Aurangabad and **11** from **Savitribai Phule** Pune University Pune.

The Resource Persons also called here from all over India, **6** from **outside** Maharashtra (Chennai, Delhi, Kolkata, Aligarh, Amarkantak and Delhi) and rest from **different** parts of Maharashtra.

The aim of the Short Term Course was almost achieved as the Resource Persons focused on how to teach particular topic to the Students. I hope these teachers will **inculcate** the teaching pedagogies to their students. Thus new tools and knowledge will be **imparted** to students from different parts of India through the participant teachers. The details regarding **focus** on how to teach is as follows:

1. Dr. Umesh Bagade in his keynote address discussed about various trends in Indian Historiography and focused on how to teach to the students. He also focused on two way interaction between teacher and the students so as to understand the needs, knowledge of the students. He stressed the need to make students alert and prepare them to grasp various concepts deeply.
2. Dr. V Geetha gave an excellent lecture on Feminist Historiography and also focused on how to teach students. She asked participants to make a group discussion on feminist questions. Teacher should finally give his/her opinion on the topic.
3. Dr. Radhika Seshan delivered studious lectures on Medieval historiography and Maritime historiography, in which she focused on questioning the students about the topic so that we should know how much they are understanding.
4. Dr. Prakash Shirsat discussed the important aspect of nationalism and historiography. He also told to include students in the teaching learning process by two way interaction between students and teacher.
5. Dr. Shruti Tambe delivered an excellent lecture on Interdisciplinary approach to Social History, in which she made a group discussion of the participants and showed how students should be involved in the teaching learning process.
6. Dr. Arun Bandopadhyaya delivered two lectures on Socio-Cultural Historiography in India: Some Methodological and Substantial Issues. He also focused on using new technology such as ICT to make the students understand the topic.
7. Dr. Raja Dixit also focused on interdisciplinary approach to Indian historiography and added new techniques of teaching such as discussing with students on the topic, asking them to present their views and finally giving them proper idea of the topic.
8. Dr. Lahu Gaikwad also told how to teach local historiography to the students with taking them out to historical places in the villages.
9. Dr. Anirudh Deshpande delivered two lectures on Making of Modern Historiography and Indian Cinema and History. He also focused on the new way of teaching students through the use of modern technology. He told that the student should get the idea of the topic by watching movies and reading reference books and then there should be a discussion on it in the classroom.
10. Dr. Ishrat Alam delivered two lectures on Technology and Society in Pre-Modern India and focused on use of PPTs to make the topic easy for students. His presentation was very easy to understand due to use of modern technology.
11. Dr. Kishor Gaikwad delivered amazing lectures on Post-Marxism tools of Analysis in History, Interdisciplinary Approach to Ancient Indian History and Micro-history: Interdisciplinary to Cross-disciplinary Approach. He focused on how to use Post Marxist tools for analysis of Indian History. He also taught us how to teach Ancient Indian History with interdisciplinary approach with his ppt presentation. He also taught how the research should be done at micro level with citing an example of Dalit Culture in Mumbai. He used govt. data to do his research.

12. Dr. Rambhau Mutkule delivered studious lecture on Maratha **Historiography: Some Substantial Issues, in which** he focused on Chhatrapati Sambhaji's **history**. He focused on how to rewrite history by using interdisciplinary tools.
13. Prof. Devendra Ingle delivered two lectures on In Search of New **Theories** to interrogating Indian History – **Genocide Theory** and **Critical Race Theory**. He also **told** how to use new theories to rewrite **Indian Historiography** by using **Interdisciplinary approach**. With the help of **Power Point Presentation** how we can make the students **prepare for understanding** a particular topic.
14. Dr. Chandrakant Bawiskar delivered excellent lecture on **Education and Writing of History** in which he also focused on new tools to teach students effectively.
15. Dr. Nirmal Kumar delivered two excellent lectures on **Cultural Historiography** and **Medieval Historiography, in which** he also focused on the use of **ICT and participation** of students in the teaching learning process.
16. Dr. Dilip Chavan delivered excellent lectures on **Post-Colonial Historiography** and **Gender Studies** where he **taught us** how to involve students in the process of **teaching learning** with the help of **ppts and questioning** the students on the topic. He focused on **how to learn and do research on Feminist History**.

I am very glad to inform you that all the participants are very satisfied **with this course** and they are very thankful for arranging **such a wonderful course** which provided them **new tools and techniques** to teach their students. 


